SANGSTER SHIELD 2019 RESULTS

Thanks to all who took part this year. Numbers were up with 20 logs received from 17 of the 19 Branches on air. From my analysis of logs there were 24 participants in total. A few new callsigns of experienced operators appeared this year with just one first timer applying to enter the Transistor Trophy.

Scores are mostly improved on last year but conditions were poor for long distance contacts. Only 2 VK's have been claimed, one at 21:16 on Saturday & the other at 22:47 on Sunday, both with serial 001. This compares with 15 VK's last year & 50 the year before. Ionospheric absorption seems to be responsible as vertical incidence short distance contacts were well represented but VK's & even South to North ZL's had trouble. Good for us in the middle for once!

Congratulations to Open Section winner Bill ZL3VZ operating near Portage which once again also gives him the Arthur Stevens (top South Island) Trophy. Bill now has four Open & five South Island wins & he is dangerously close to Paul ZL1PC's all time five Opens milestone.

Paul ZL1XH takes second place just ahead of Grant ZL2GD third.

South Islanders Grant ZL2GD & Barry ZL2LN take 2^{nd} & 3^{rd} places in the Arthur Stevens Trophy successfully defending their last year's positions.

Congratulations to first time entrant Robin ZL2IW who gains the Transistor Trophy this year. Robin was a last minute participant who was encouraged to enter to permit Branch 22 to qualify for the Tony Fletcher Award and provide competition for Whangarei's 2016,17&18 hat trick.

Sure enough, with Bill ZLVZ's anchor score, Marlborough Branch 22 has outflanked Whangarei by a large margin to record their first win of the Tony Fletcher (ZL2ALJ) Memorial Trophy (Branch Award). Operators were Bill ZL3VZ, Gerard ZL2GVA and Robin ZL2IW. Gallant defender Whangarei was the only other Branch with 3 entrants.

The 18 qualifying active Branches were: -2,3,5,13,16,22,24,28,30,37,42,50,56,68,69,84,87,88.

I have removed branch 20 (ZL2AUB) from branch claims on grounds of low contacts. ZL2AUB worked during the first ½ hour period on Saturday. The highest serial number recorded by entrants was 005. This action has reversed 2nd & 3rd places & caused 2 pairs of entrants to "dead heat" further down the table.

In line with my earlier practice I have not removed 2AUB's contact points since we all would sooner have more participants on air whether for a long or short time.

All other low scoring participants operated for longer periods, appeared in many more logs or were using the same branch number as other higher scoring entrants.

I have some observations as Manager:-

- Logs submitted were of a high standard of readability. A few repetitive Branch number errors were still present this year. I have corrected & allowed these & other minor copying errors where the contact could be traced from serial numbers on matching logs.
- ZL4IG was recorded in a few logs with Branch number 30 instead of 37. Luckily Robin is an entrant & from his log I was able to improve on some others Branch claims which contained this "blemish".
- I am impressed that experienced first timers refrained from requesting entry to the Transistor Trophy & this is an example of the great spirit of the Sangster.
