The attached media release describes an upcoming two-day training event for radio operators and others interested in assisting with emergency communications during natural or other disasters.

For nearly 100 years, amateur ("ham") radio operators have stepped in to fill vital communications gaps when commercial and governmental infrastructure was compromised by
