A New Kid on the Block and How to Beat the HF Propagation Blues

The new kid on the block is RandomGram (RG), the brainchild of Drew AF2Z.

It's an innovative CW contest requiring participants to make a two-way exchange of 5-letter groups. Each RandomGram event runs for nine hours and is fully explained at <a href="https://groups.io/g/RandomGram">https://groups.io/g/RandomGram</a>

Unfortunately, the fickleness of HF propagation has put a big damper on RG for us in the south-west Pacific. While intra-US contacts are going wild, it is very difficult if not impossible for us in the Oceania region to make any headway at all. So far Oceania contacts have been made only during the ninth hour. The result is lamentably low scores.

So how do we propose to beat the HF propagation blues? Easy. By banding together a strong cohort of VK and ZL operators, RG 5-letter code groups can then be exchanged in the Oceania region while trans-Pacific propagation simply isn't possible, and thus, at least to some degree, we will achieve a better geographic balance in the RG score lists.

The SKCC sked page is used extensively in real time by those seeking RG contacts.

Use it to announce your own availability and specify frequencies. <a href="https://sked.skccgroup.com/">https://sked.skccgroup.com/</a>

A practical demonstration for the use of 5-letter groups occurred the day after Event # 3 when a significant bonus in the form of an Enigma encrypted message was transmitted by the sponsored Maritime Radio Historical Society's station KPH in northern California. Considering that Enigma encrypted traffic consists of several groups of four or five random-letters, this bonus event was entirely in keeping with the RG educational concept. One-hundred thirteen successful decryptions of the KPH message were submitted to K6KPH and a rather nice

'Certificate of Cryptographic Achievement' was subsequently awarded to each operator. We've been advised to expect more such bonuses.
