AREC Assistance with Nat System



Hi all. The national system has been recognized as a critical asset to amateur radio in New Zealand, and has a high degree of importance during emergencies throughout New Zealand, providing the equipment is maintained to a high standard.

Ngā Irirangi Ohotata Tūao

Parts of the National System are aging and as equipment ages, its resilience also wanes. As such AREC has offered to assist with enhancing works performed on the national system, including replacement on aged repeaters, feedlines, and antennas. If you want to take

advantage of this offer please contact your AREC regional manager to assist you with making an application.

Assistance from AREC cannot be guaranteed due to the demands on their funds and availability of resources/people. However, if an application is made and they 1) are able and 2) see benefit in supporting infrastructure resilience enhancements they may be able to contribute. Initial focus will likely be on high-risk sites. Equipment ownership (and liabilities) will remain with the branch.

Please take advantage of this offer as the moment of truth with the national system is that it is working when it is needed which could be any time.

NASA Satellites



NASA's ELaNa-43 mission's launch provider Firefly Aerospace has just announced that it has successfully deployed eight satellites. They will pass overhead around 9AM and 9PM local time daily. It might be a day or two before we have accurate Two Line Elements available for your tracking programs, monitor here as we will pass along information as we get it.

We expect to hear the following spacecraft operating in

the Amateur Satellite Service:

MESAT-1 30 kHz wide V/U Transponder plus a 1k2 BPSK telemetry downlink. Telemetry downlink 435.800 MHz with transponder downlink 435.810-435.840 MHz, and transponder uplink 145.910-145.940 MHz Use AMSAT's FoxTelem software to collect telemetry.

Serenity 4k8 FM with AX25 downlink on 437.100 MHz

CatSat UHF downlink using 9k6 or 38k4 GMSK but will also relay WSPR and FT8 signals from HF. Downlinks on 437.185 MHz and 10470.00 MHz

KubeSat 1 UHF downlink using 9k6 GMSK. A downlink on 437.085 MHz

SOC-i UHF downlink using 4k8 GMSK. downlink 437.125 MHz
