#### These modes will be -

1. FM (2m plus 70cm) for Auckland area calls on Klondyke Repeater or National System.

- 2. HF (40M) for longer distances on 7.150 MHz
- 3. DMR on Brandmeister TG 907 (JOTA), TG 5301 (NZ North) and TG 95 (NZ and Aust).

## Special Event Callsign ZM100DX

This article is to make you aware of the upcoming centenary celebration of the first transglobal antipodean two-way radio contact from New Zealand to the United Kingdom on 18<sup>th</sup> October 1924. This was between amateur radio operators 4AA (Frank Bell – Shag Valley, South Island, NZ) and 2SZ (Cecil Goyder – Mill Hill School, London).

Branch 30 NZART will be on-site at the Shag Valley site for approximately 1 week before the 18<sup>th</sup> October date and a couple of days afterwards. We will be operating as a field station on most HF bands (CW, SSB and FT8) and also on VHF DN690 (All Star access node 61891) and DN665 (IRLP 6507).

Please look out for the callsign ZL4AA on bands as mentioned above, which will be the callsign used at Shag Valley. (12<sup>th</sup> until 20<sup>th</sup> October 2024)

We will be attempting to recreate the original 1924 QSO on 18<sup>th</sup> October 2024.

This callsign will be available for operators throughout NZ to use by booking your favored time slots, operating band and mode. You can book these using the following link to a <u>Google Sheets document</u>.
