SANGSTER SHIELD 2006 RESULTS

A big thank you to all who took part this year. Entries were received from a record 26 operators.

Congratulations to John ZL1ALZ in winning the Sangster Shield.

At just 3 contacts less, Paul ZL1PC takes 2nd place with Ron ZL1TW making the top 3.

Armin ZL1KMN has gained the Transistor Trophy (less than one year licensed) with strong competition from Matthew ZL1MAT. Armin also managed two VK contacts - well done.

Barry ZL2LN (Branch 24) gains the South Island Trophy from the 3 entrants.

Barry had a spot of bother in reporting his Branch as 28 instead of 24. *Lets call it a keyer programming glitch!*. He realised this after Saturday's session & contacted Branch 28 & myself. All agreed that it was best he retain Branch 28 for Sunday to avoid total confusion. I have reworked all logs & credited Branch 24 to all except 2 entrants who were well down the table & had not managed to contact Barry. No positions were changed due to this action.

VKs were well represented in logs after a total absence in last year's aurora. Ian Godsil VK3JS has amassed a creditable score with 30 DX contacts from his single tube 4 watt transceiver.

Papakura Branch 65 gains the Branch Award from 28 & 50 - all of which managed 3 or more entries. This is a huge improvement over last year. Six logs were received from Branch 28.

The 21 qualifying active Branches were:-3,8,10,13,25,27,(24),28,29,30,33,40,42,45,50,56,65,66,71,72,78

This year I have deducted only one Branch (34) as a multiplier but contact points still count of course. I would like to re-iterate that operators are encouraged to take part in the contest no matter how few contacts they can manage. We would all sooner have the extra activity rather than less.

Once again the scoring task was a pleasure as was the opportunity for me to take part this year.

Comments received were:-

- ZL6FF (ZL2BSJ) Operated from Quartz Hill (Makara) using the Fists CW Club call sign.
- ZL1PC Berates lack of Auckland stations with all its population.
- ZL1WI Noted that he worked several stations only once. I note also that Roy has upgraded from Yaesu FT767 to Home Brew transistor transceiver with improved score of course! ZL2KZ.
- ZL4KJ Signals were good copy but struggled to get through the QRM with 4 watts & 15 ft high antenna.
- Many operators commented that Sunday night was the better all round conditions. It certainly was for me - but this year I also have neighbours plasma TVs & halogen light electronic power units to contend with. Just wait until power line data hits the suburbs.

<u>Stay with a 2 night Contest</u> - In view of the resurgence in activity and the many this year who supported the 2 nights I have recommended to the Contest Manager that we stick to this format while we are ahead. I note that the Memorial Contest also returned to a 2 night format this year.
