SANGSTER SHIELD 2011 RESULTS

Thanks to all who took part this year. Numbers were well down but logs were received from 11 operators out of about xx active calls.

Congratulations to Barry ZL2LN (Motueka) in winning the Sangster Shield first time after a couple of years as runner up.

Barry also takes the Arthur Stevens Trophy as top South Island Station. Lets call this an historic first!. Records available to me (including the NZART History publication) do not show any SI station as a Shield winner. - Thanks Barry for achieving this distinction.

There is a dead heat for 2nd equal between Bill ZL2AYZ & Mike ZL2AUA. This is the first time I have seen equal scores among the Certificate entries.

This means that South Island station fill both first & 2nd places in the Shield. More history made this year.

With only 3 South Island logs this year Bill ZL2AYZ & Gilbert ZL3UJZ take the Arthur Stevens 2nd & 3rd places behind Barry ZL2LN.

I have allocated 3rd to myself but maybe I should be 4th?

There is no qualifying Branch with 3 entrants so no Branch Award this year.

There were also no newly licensed entrants for the Transistor Trophy.

The 11 qualifying active Branches were: - 3,22,24,28,29,35,50,56,72,84,88.

Although activity was very low for some operators they were in Branches with others & I have not deducted any Branch claims.

The toughest Branches to work were South Otago (35) & Ch-Ch West (56) - with Gilbert's 2 watts. These stations recorded contacts over several operating periods & all Shield certificate holders worked both of these stations.

VKs made up the numbers. Ken's (ZL2AIH) Check log recorded 6 VKs on Saturday & just 1 VK on Sunday)

Strange how over half the entrants failed to score ZL1BVB as over 5 watts. Based on consensus (but not my own log) I am prepared to believe that /99 was sent for all contacts & I have rescored claims.

Comments received:-

- Reasonable conditions but not very many on.
- A very quiet Contest Why?
- Could there be greater promotion in future? Suggesting reminder in Break In, Info Line, Official broadcast. I agree this year has been a wake up call 2KZ.
- ZL3UJZ did jolly well to get up as far as Kerikeri (northern-most station) with only 2 watts.
- VKs were coming in like gangbusters making up the numbers on Saturday, but not a peep out of them on Sunday.
- Lack of contacts caused many to abandon the contest leaving just 7 of us on in the last hour.
- Great sportsmanship again among the hardy few.
