## **Jock White Field Day Report 2025**

First, next year is the case where there are only three full weekends in February. This means that Field Day goes to February 28-March 1. This is to avoid a clash with the ARRL international CW contest.

Thanks to all of you who went out into the field to operate, this was the best turn out in years with a total of 92 valid multipliers active. With all the ham crams we may be turning a corner. Christchurch branch 5 appeared too: thanks guys. Lets keep it up in 2026! There were a few more branches active on CW too. The weather was good across most of the country except for South Otago and Southland where they experienced wind and rain. An interesting break from tradition this year was hearing the Franklin branch on CW, having been phone only for years. Warren ZL2AJ operating as Waitomo branch 55 operated from a peak in the Waikato; SOTA and Field Day!

Propagation was a mixed bag with 40 metres being very good even at 0600 on Sunday, but 80 was pretty lousy, worse than last year which was not that great either.

There were the usual worried admissions of muck ups with cyphers etc: e.g. the same numbers repeated for the next hour. I still allow these contacts, don't worry.

VK3AVV logging software: can teams using this please take more effort with tidying up their entries. In several cases I get an entry for each band mode, and the multiplier lists are not in tidy columns making my job harder.

Summary sheets 1-4: Most digital entries use these, but a few don't. Please transcribe your multipliers and scoring over to these pages, it would save the VK3AVV problem above too.

Another plea to those scoring digitally: do a sanity check of your claimed multipliers, check for garbage in-garbage out. Just one example is claiming ZL2KO for branch 20 and branch 21.

With the new website some of you had trouble finding the rules etc. I will take this up with the webmaster, I think this will be a one off. One good suggestion was to have a banner link on the home page in the month leading up to the event which I will follow up on.

Minimum contact numbers: there were ten cases of being below this. Make sure you plan what bands/modes you intend to operate on to reach 50 phone or 20 CW contacts. I find it quite irritating when a branch makes 3 or 4 CW contacts for example. These are deleted by me, and the they are not valid for the branches that wasted their time at the other end.
