Participation in the contest was up from last year. Thanks to the DX stations (VK and FK8) who joined in the fun. Congratulations to all the category winners, especially to Bill ZL3VZ who was overall winner. A very impressive score too! Well done to the two entrants in the New Ham category (licensed <18 months) ZL1GGL and ZM2CJ. I hope you enjoyed the experience and will be back next year!

**Logs:** This year I received a larger than normal number of logs with QSO time recording errors. This appears to be due to people logging on paper then transferring to electronic format later. This method is prone to human error, starting with unclear writing then multiplied by transcription errors. There were many evenings spent trying to correct all these so as not to unduly penalise the QSO partner.

High quality PDF certificates are emailed to category winners. These can be printed on good quality card at your local stationery store for around \$5 and make a nice addition to your shack wall.

## Log observations and tips:

I use the W3KM Cabrillo Evaluation software to cross check all logs and adjust the scoring based on NIL (Not In Log) and incorrect logging of the exchange. Therefore, your published score will usually be less than your claimed score.

- Be careful copying the exchange and if you are not sure, ask for a repeat there were a lot of incorrect exchanges recorded this year with subsequent loss of those QSOs
- Ensure you are *sending* the correct exchange!
- Embrace electronic logging and ensure your computer clock is set accurately. The internationally accepted time tolerance is ±5 minutes. **Logs must be in UTC** if you use one of the recommended programs, it takes care of this for you. If you are logging on paper, please take to care to record the correct time for each QSO (and make sure it is neat enough to decipher when entering into the computer!).
- Ensure that the other station has your correct call, use (standard) phonetics in SSB to help with this and if they read back the incorrect call, correct them.

Currently two free contest logging software programmes fully support the NZART Memorial Contest and produce Cabrillo format logs: **N1MM Logger**+ and **VKCL.** Several logs used WA7BNM online conversion which is hard work (typing/transcribing) for you and is prone to errors. Please try one of these excellent loggers or RUMLOG (Linux and Apple). As amateurs we are supposed to be progressive. If anyone is genuinely struggling with the change to electronic logging, drop me a note (contests@nzart.org.nz) and we'll work on it together.

An alternative to using a dedicated Contest logger is to export an ADIF file from your usual logger and convert to Cabrillo using one of the many tools available on the web. This is much more reliable than logging on paper and then entering later.

8 stations who made >10 QSOs didn't submit logs. Some of these would have scored quite well. Please send in your log, regardless of how many QSOs you make.

Thanks for participating in the contest this year and I look forward to seeing you all in the next Memorial Contest in July 2026. Note that we will trial a change to a one-night contest next year, on the Saturday night.
