Mission Statement

“To promote shared learning and technological advancement in the field of digital communications and electronics”

Digital Voice NZART Branch 404 (not found) is to be a nationwide (and international if there is an interest) virtual branch, a branch only found on the internet. The branch will primarily serve as a membership hub for digital voices and secondly serve as an engine to grow and diversify the DVNZ radio network.

Core Values

404 will not serve to compete with other branches. The intention is not to take members away, but rather to offer another gathering place where digitally focused hams might find better support for their journey.

We know anyone can belong to many branches, however they must choose one for remit voting and election voting of President & Council. If they choose Br 404, they must advise the

NZART Business Manager in writing to transfer their branch affiliation from their current one to Br 404 and we welcome them with open arms.

404 will be flexible and move in whatever direction best fits its members, while loosely keeping within the territory of digital communications.

Special interest groups that don't specifically fall into the category of amateur radio such as IP networkers or mechatronics tinkerers are to be expected and encouraged.

There will remain a necessity for members to either hold or be working towards obtaining their General Amateur Operator's Certificate or international equivalent. Official roles within the club structure will not be gatekept.

If members who actively contribute show an interest in an official role then the current officers will help the interested member to understand the role and prepare them to step into the role at the next opportunity.

All interests that loosely fit digital radio/electronics will be supported as far as the club can reasonably do so, or endeavour to assist an interested party in finding the correct special interest group where the club is unable to immediately support it.

Our sole aim is to offer another option for amateurs who may or may not be members of NZART, that have a more digital approach to the hobby of amateur radio.

Note: The award is **not** limited to amateur radio operators or their organizations.

received by March 14, 2026 and include:

- A detailed explanation supporting the nominee's qualifications according to the above criteria.
- Complete contact information of the person submitting the nomination.

Presentation of Award - A plaque will be presented at the Dayton Hamvention. If a recipient is not present, it will be sent to them.

Special notice

Starting February 13, the FCC will restrict U.S. amateur radio stations from operating at 100 watts on 5.357 MHz, limiting power to just 9.5 watts on that frequency. To continue operating at 100 watts, many U.S. DXers will move their FT8 activity to a new frequency: 5.371.5 MHz, effective the same date.

Operators are encouraged to inform friends, club members, and relevant news outlets about

this change to ensure a smooth transition.

While many other countries will continue using the original frequency, it is important to notify anyone planning DXpeditions of the U.S. shift to 5.371.5 MHz.

OZ100OZ Award 2026

100 years since the first Legal Danish amateur radio license were issued.

In March 1926, the **Ministry of Public Works** finally decided to give experimental Danish amateurs access to build and operate private radio transmitting stations on a legal basis. Thus, Børge Jørgensen OZ7BJ and James Steffensen OZ7JS became the first two Danish radio amateurs to be issued a valid Danish broadcasting license and this happened in March 1926 - 100 years ago.

During 1926, more than 40 new OZ-licenses were issued, thus legalizing the use of their transmitting equipment.

Experimental Danish Radio Amateurs are celebrating this by activating an event from **1st March at 00:00 UTC to 8th March at 23:59 UTC**, where the call sign OZ100OZ will be on the air.

All two-way contacts and SWL reports count towards the diploma.

Contact with OZ100OZ on different bands or modes (CW, SSB or DIGI) counts 1 point. Max. 3 points per band.

There are three categories of diplomas:

DX: GOLD=8 - SILVER=6 - BRONZE= 4 (Stations outside Europe)

EU: GOLD=14 - SILVER=10 - BRONZE=6 (Stations in Europe)

OZ: GOLD=18 - SILVER=14 - BRONZE=8 (Stations in Denmark)

on <https://clublog.org/logsearch/OZ100OZ> before you submit an application! *Applications must be submitted no later than December 31, 2026.*

Print your own diploma

This diploma is free. Send an email to award manager oz4cg@live.dk with information about your callsign, as well as each QSO with date, time, mode and frequency. We will check the log and send an email with the diploma attached as a PDF file.

Printed and laminated diploma

The diploma costs 75 DKK. Send your PayPal payment together with the information mentioned above, plus your postal address, to "Laminate manager": ha@hand.dk
